- Os oes angen i chi ddefnyddio car, ceisiwch barcio o leiaf 5 munud i ffwrdd o'r ysgol a cherdded i mewn. Mae'n bwysig meddwl am drigolion lleol drwy beidio â rhwystro dreifiau a ffyrdd preswyl.
- Bydd cerbydau'n dal i fod ar y strydoedd. Bydd stiwardiaid wrth y rhwystrau yn dweud wrth yrwyr sydd â chaniatâd i ddefnyddio'r stryd y dylent beidio â gyrru'n rhy gyflym drwy'r ardal gyfyngedig.
- Mae rhieni/gofalwyr yn parhau i fod yn gyfrifol am eu plant bob amser. Goruchwylwch eich plentyn i/o fynedfa'r ysgol.

Dear Parent/Guardian,

Denbighshire County Council, in partnership with Ysgol Emmanuel and Sustrans will be trialling a Street on **22nd January 2025**.

To achieve this, **Ernest Street, Sisson Street and Victoria Road** will be closed to non-essential traffic (see map on the back) during the school pick up time.

The closure will be in place between **8:00 - 9:15** and **14:30 - 16:00**.

Exemptions will apply, including residents, emergency services, school transport, blue badge holders, deliveries and carers of residents on the street. Any parking restrictions within the school street will operate as normal.

Important safety information during the School Street:

- Please support us by walking, cycling or scooting to and from school.
- If you do need to use a car, please try and park at least 5 minutes away from the school and walk in. It is important to be mindful of local residents by not obstructing driveways and blocking residential roads.
- Vehicles will still be present on the streets. Permitted drivers will be advised by stewards at the barriers to limit their speed through the restricted area.
- Parents/carers remain responsible for their children at all times. Please supervise your child to/from the school entrance.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

SCHOOL STREETS

"School Streets aim to create a safer, calmer and more pleasant area outside the school gate to make it easier for people to walk and wheel to school."



Frequently asked questions:

What is a School Street?

A School Street is a timed road closure at the beginning and the end of the school day enforced by physical barriers.

What is the purpose of a School Street?

- To create a safer and more pleasant environment for families while tackling congestion and reducing risk from motorised vehicles
- To encourage walking, scooting, cycling and wheeling to and from school
- To improve the air quality in the immediate area outside of the school

How does a School Street work?

A specific street or a section of the street around a participating school will temporarily restrict non-essential motor vehicle access at set times in the morning and afternoon. Vehicles will not be allowed to enter the street during the operating times unless they are exempt (see the back of this letter).

Signs and barriers at the entrances to the scheme will inform drivers of the restriction. Advanced warning signs will be installed where necessary. Stewards at the barriers will ask drivers to provide proof that they are permitted to enter the street and will only allow authorised vehicles to enter e.g. residents, business owners etc.

What is the legal position of closing the road?

The restrictions are operated in partnership with the school and the local authority. A traffic regulation order (TRO) will be put in place, which allows the road to be temporarily closed by law. As a legal document, TRO's help us manage the highway network for all road users, improving safety and access.

Why are we having a School Street trial?

A one day trial of a School Street provides an opportunity to assess feasibility, gather monitoring data, engage with the community, encourage behavior change, and ensure safety before considering a more permanent implementation. It can help address potential concerns or challenges that may arise.

If the trial is judged to be successful, based on the results of monitoring, along with feedback from the school community and local residents, the closure may be made permanent.

What about deliveries/visitors?

We would ask residents to try to schedule deliveries, so they arrive outside the restricted times. If this is not possible, delivery drivers would be permitted to enter the zone. We would ask that any visitors could try and time their arrivals and departures outside of the closure times. However, if they enter the restricted area before the restriction start time, they can leave the street at any time.

As a Blue Badge holder, can I enter the School Street?

Blue Badge holders are permitted to enter and leave the School Street. Blue Badge holders are requested to ensure that their Blue Badge is clearly visible on the dashboard.

Will school staff be allowed to enter the School Street?

Yes. If the school has on-premises parking, school staff would be permitted to enter the School Street during the timed restrictions to access the parking. We ask staff to avoid doing this if possible, and to arrive and leave outside the times the restrictions are in place.

What are the next steps?

Surveys will be distributed to your school community, residents, and neighbouring stakeholders to assess the School Street Pilot's effectiveness. The collected data and feedback will be presented to the local authority to determine its suitability for future implementation.
